Start your day with a stop at the historic *Missouri History Museum* at the Jefferson Memorial. Here you will take a docent-led tour of the special exhibit, 250 in 250 which celebrates the anniversary of 250 years in St. Louis through stories of 50 people, 50 places, 50 moments, 50 images, and 50 objects.

Enjoy time throughout the halls to explore another incredible exhibit, *American Spirits: The Rise and Fall of Prohibition*. Step back in time to an era of flappers and suffragists, bootleggers and temperance workers, and real-life legends like Al Capone and Carry Nation. View rare artifacts including flapper dresses, temperance propoganda, a 1929 Buick Marquette, and original ratification copies of the 18th and 21st Amendments.

After lunch at Favazza's on the Hill, you'll visit the iconic Anheuser-Busch Brewery. Situated in a 100-acre complex with over 70 red brick structures, the Brewery buildings are known for their unique architecture. During the tour, you will see the World Famous Clydesdales, the Fermentation Building, the Packaging and Bottling Plant, the Brew House and a film about the brewing process. No visit would be complete without a stop in the hospitality room to sample one or two!
