Connecticut Family Sends Treats to Soldiers on the Front Line

NASHVILLE, Tenn., September 30, 2009 –It started as a simple family effort to boost morale for the soldiers in one Aviation Brigade. Four years later, Michael Weinshel, his wife Carol, and his sisterin-law, Susan Spivack, continue to support soldiers by sending regular gift packages.
